Dr. Callan joins Osteosarcoma Institute Strategic Advisory Board




How do implants overlying the spine influence "The Law of Diminishing Returns" in early-onset scoliosis patients? - Spine Deformity





This following study highlights the "law of diminishing returns" (LODR) in early-onset scoliosis (EOS). UT Southwestern Orthopaedic Surgery and Scottish Rite for Children researchers hypothesized that previously observed variations between constructs may be related to the lateral distance that each construct lies from the spine.
