We enjoyed all of the holiday festivities and look forward to them each holiday season.








Work Anniversaries - January 2024

Dr. Grewal teaching in the JnJ Complex Hip & Knee Revision Symposium




Dr. Raspovic is once again a part of the conference committee, the vital group that helps put on the event every year.




Comparison of Gait and Functional Outcomes Between Open and Arthroscopic Treatment of Adolescent and Young Adult Femoroacetabular Impingement


